Subject: State-Approved Medication Aide Written Examination

The Division of Health Service Regulation (DHSR) has partnered with the state-competency examination vendor, Credentia, to enhance accessibility for Candidates to take state-approved competency examinations in North Carolina. Below is information regarding upcoming activities that will impact adult care facilities.

Timeline of Events

- January 28, 2022 February 13, 2022: All systems will be down to migrate testing data from Pearson VUE legacy systems to Credentia's CNA365® credentialing system. Candidates will not be able to register for an examination.
- February 14, 2022: Training for Candidates will be posted on the Credentia <u>website</u> for North Carolina.
- February 14, 2022: Credentia's new CNA365® credentialing system will go live.

Process Changes

Beginning February 14, 2022, Credentia will no longer use the current computer-based test (CBT) sites from Pearson VUE. Candidates will be able to take the state-approved medication aide written examination conveniently from their home or office via an online proctored examination process. Additional information about the online proctored examination will be available on Credentia's website for North Carolina when the new CNA365° credentialing system is available.
