Renewal Requirements

A listing on the North Carolina Medication Aide Registry for Adult Care Facilities does not expire and does not need to be renewed.

Registry Information

Reciprocity

North Carolina does not list Medication Aides by [reciprocity](#), endorsement, or transfer from other states.

Registry Information

Nursing Home

A name listed on the North Carolina Medication Aide Registry for Adult Care Facilities DOES NOT qualify an individual to administer medications in a Nursing Home.

Registry Information

Registry Verification

- A listing on the North Carolina Medication Aide Registry for Adult Care Facilities is the only verification that an individual has successfully passed the Medication Aide examination.

- Employers should keep a record of accessing the North Carolina Medication Aide Registry for Adult Care Facilities in their business files (e.g., the date and confirmation number from the registry).

Registry Information

When to Contact the Division of Health Service Regulation

- Medication Aides should contact the Registry Office after 10 business days from taking the examination if they have not received their results.
- Due to high call volumes, you may experience extended wait times while contacting the Registry Office.
